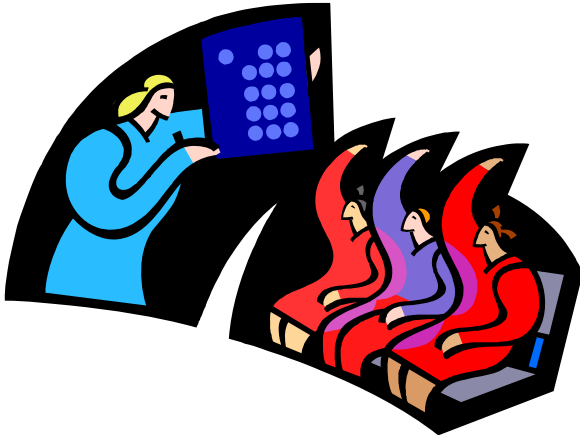

Web-Based Teaching: Strategies and Methods for designing a Web-Based Course

Distance Education is fast becoming a very useful, efficient, and effective form of teaching and learning. In a virtual on-line environment this computer mediated communication focuses on person-to-person interaction and refers to the use of computer networks to allow learners in different geographical locations to interact with one another either in synchronous (real-time) or asynchronous (delayed) mode via a text-based communication anytime anywhere.

Cynthia Johnson, RN, MSN, EdD, and Douglas Borcoman, EdD introduced this new form of education with most helpful tips on designing web based courses. They explained how to set up a design using multimedia designs and courseware platforms.

Dr. Borcoman showed through actual computer programs the windows movie maker, the real player, streaming server, and how switching back and forth made the learning process so interesting and informative.

Dr. Johnson introduced the tools that are available such as e-mail, live chat, threaded discussion board and programs such as "Blackboard" and presented the instructor's role as more of a provider of information or a facilitator, guide or coach. This method can certainly expose the professor to new experiences, which can in turn bring enthusiasm back into their teaching.

This program was enjoyed by all and their new techniques were on the cutting edge of technology and yet remain cost-effective.
