Program Description

The purpose of the program is to discuss the evolution, funding, and utilization of the Simulation Lab as pedagogy. Targeted issues will focus on the opportunities of collaboration and the barriers of sustainability. Key topics of the day will include: Cost effective synergies; operational considerations; the benefits of a Mentorship Program, utilizing professional staff in the development of student nurses; integration of Simulation Scenarios into the New Grad Program; and effective barrier busting. A panel discussion for questions and answers will open dialogue between participants.

1. The history behind funding the lab, linking community colleges with the Nursing Institute.
2. The partnership benefits of simulation.
3. How to support a simulation program.
4. Push backs to expect and strategies for a successful lab.
